



Camonica Valley and Oglio River, BRESCIA

“BEDOLINA MAP” AND CAMONICA VALLEY, MAN AND BIOSPHERE UNESCO RESERVE

One-day tour around Camonica Valley, Man and Biosphere UNESCO Reserve (2018) and Italy's first recognized UNESCO World Heritage Site n94 (1979) for the larger collection of prehistoric petroglyphs in the world.

Participants will travel in time and see the prehistoric stone carvings, including the “Bedolina map”,

the oldest landscape map in the world.

Moreover, the environmental and environmental redevelopment interventions carried out over seven years of work along the Oglio river will be visited and described.

In 2017, the project was awarded by the Ministry of Cultural Heritage and Activities for its high ecological value and environmental sustainability.

The cycle path that runs along the Oglio river and was built as part of this project was awarded as the best Italian cycle path (Italian Green Road Award 2019).

Then, the participants will visit the landscapes of the alpine vineyards and will discuss about the management plan and the future challenges for economic, agricultural and tourist pressures sustainability.
